Physical Requirements

The physical requirements for preparing to secure cargo/containers, lashing and unlash cargo, protecting cargo from weather and packing and unpacking cargo can be very demanding and it is expected that you will have reasonable level of fitness to perform the following tasks:

- Constant hand function (fine and gross) and lifting waist to overhead and carrying up to 2kg
- Frequent standing, forward reaching, overhead reaching and static neck postures;
- Frequent lifting from floor to overhead and carrying from 2kg to 15kg;
- Frequent pushing and pulling;

You are required to discuss your capabilities in the above areas and any concerns you have during the course entry interview.
